



¹⁴Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: “Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. ¹⁵These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It’s only nine in the morning! ¹⁶No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: ¹⁷“ ‘In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams.

¹⁸Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy. ¹⁹I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke. ²⁰The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord. ²¹And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.’

²²“Fellow Israelites, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. ²³This man was handed over to you by God’s deliberate plan and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross.

²⁴But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him.

GETTING STARTED

Share a memorable story about you when you a child.

SERMON OVERVIEW

Think back to the sermon. Was there an idea or expression that spoke to you, or was there anything said that challenged or confused you?

DIGGING IN

Take turns reading a couple of verses each from Acts 2:25-41

3. What did Peter say about Jesus of Nazareth?
4. In verse 25, Peter quotes from Psalm 16:8-11. What is the significance of this passage, and how does it relate to the message that Peter is sharing with the crowd?
5. In verse 36, Peter declares that Jesus is both Lord and Christ. What does this statement mean, and how does it impact our understanding of who Jesus is and what He came to do? Why is this difficult for us to understand sometimes?
6. How did the resurrection prove that Jesus is Lord and Christ?
7. In verse 38, Peter tells the crowd to repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of their sins. Have you been baptized? If yes, what is your baptism story? If no, why not?

In verses 29-32, Peter speaks about the patriarch David and how he was a prophet, foretelling the coming of Jesus. What does this reveal about God's plan for salvation, and how does it relate to the message of the Gospel?

What is one way this week you could intentionally build a relationship with non-believers to learn about their story and help guide them toward a deeper relationship with Jesus?
